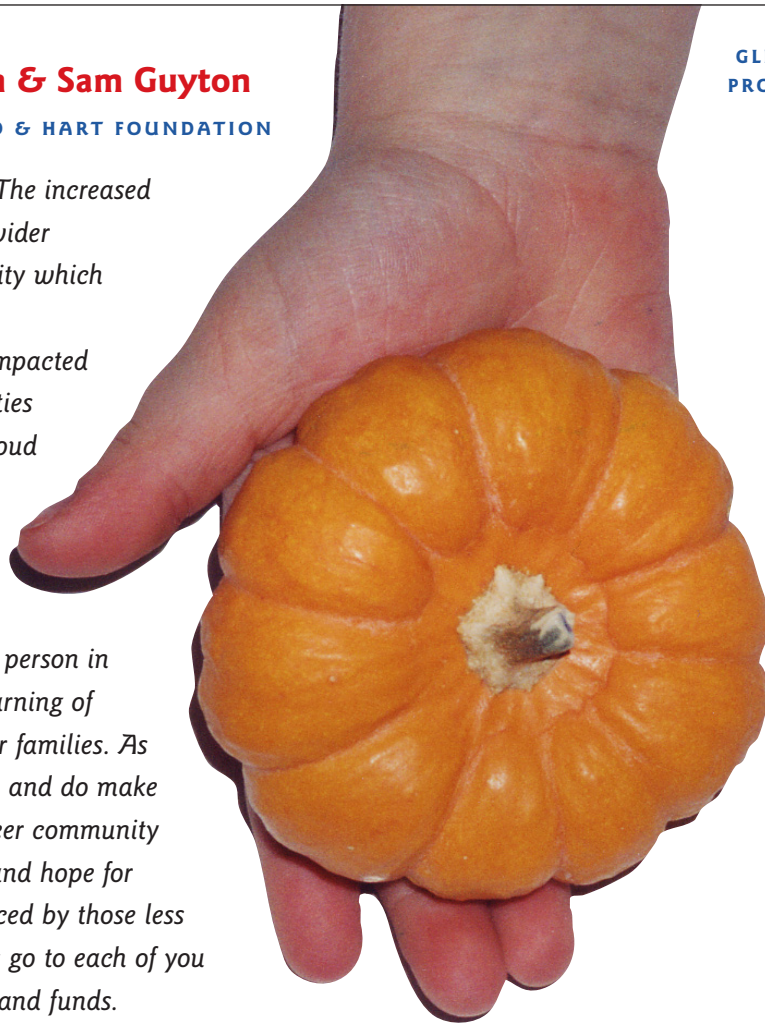
A Message from Jean & Sam Guyton

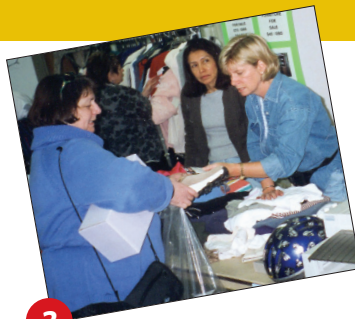

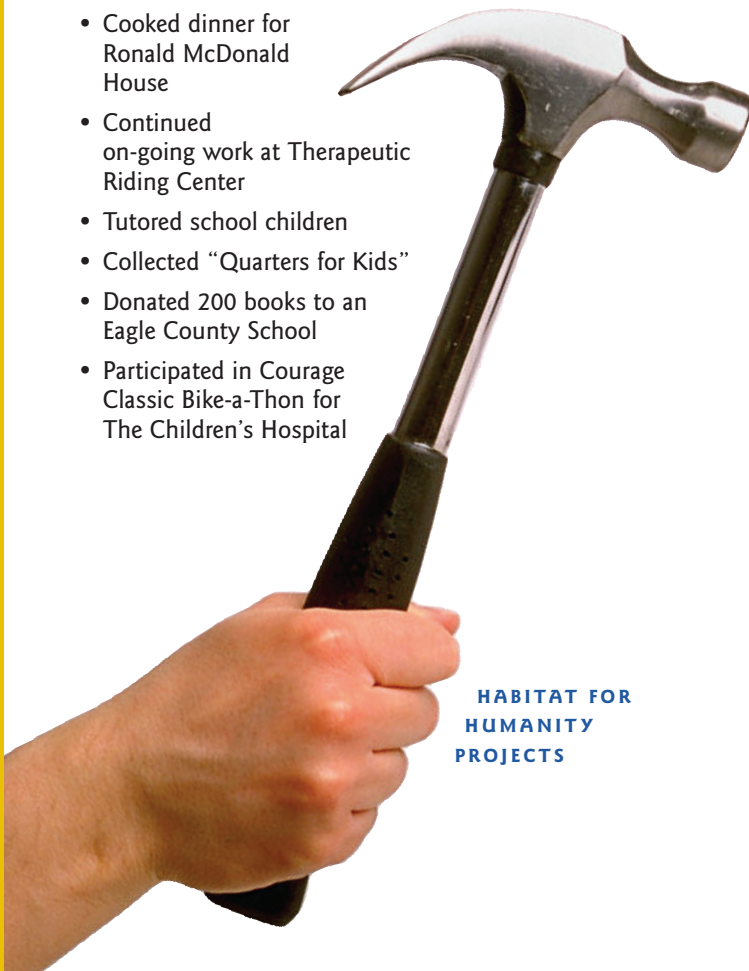
